Our Membership Renewal Deadline Is Fast Approaching

The deadline for renewal is June 15. The easiest way to renew is online. If you prefer, check. То you can also renew by renew online, go to https://www.aauw.org/membership/ Scroll down to "Learn More about AAUW Membership" and click. If you don't have an account, set one up there—it only takes a few minutes. Once you have an account, the site will automatically log you in. On the "Learn More about AAUW Membership" page, scroll down to "ExploreMembership Options" and click on National Member. The system will walk you through the steps needed to renew your memberships for National, Wisconsin, and the Monona-Madison branch.

As you know, National AAUW has increased dues by \$2/year, from \$72 to \$74. With State dues of \$13 and local branch dues of \$15, your total dues are \$102/year. This is the first increase in many years and is needed to cover rising costs.

If you need assistance using the website, there is a 3-minute video, "How to Self-Renew

Dear AAUW/Monona Madison Branch and Gail,

Thank you for your generous gift of \$2300 to the award-winning UW Odyssey Project in April. We appreciate the multiple purposes of the gift, including for our Odyssey Family Fund, for the use of UWSMP space, and for selecting two scholarship winners for 2025 - we can't wait to select recipients! **Your donation will help us continue to empower adults facing adversity to achieve their dreams!**

The photo attached shows four of our 30 students in the Class of 2025 holding their new Langston Hughes books. Ladella notes, "I am WAY MORE confident than I was when I first started Odyssey. It is making me get over my fear of public speaking, reading aloud, and asking questions." Tiana adds, "This program has built up my courage to be in a bigger school setting. I'm happy to continue." All four women in this photo have children who attend Odyssey Junior while they are in class. "I like going to Mommy's school," said one.

Odyssey students have faced huge obstacles ranging from homelessness to domestic abuse, car accidents to hospitalizations. Gifts like yours support our students and their families as they earn college credits and a new sense of purpose. Donations to our **Odyssey Project Fund** cover tuition, textbooks, Odyssey Junior instruction, and other educational costs, while our **Odyssey Family Fund** covers wrap-around support such as groceries, gas, medications, and rent. (As Langston Hughes observed in a 7-word poem, *"I wish the rent / was heaven sent."*) Donations to our **Future Fund** build an endowment to guarantee we survive uncertain times.

The <u>Class of 2025 will graduate</u> with six UW-Madison credits in English literature **this Wednesday, the 7th**, in a ceremony held in person at the Memorial Union and streamed via Zoom. Will you help us celebrate them? We now have 600+ alumni--some in graduate school, dental school, law school, and applying to medical school! Facing centuries of injustice, our Odyssey families are in greater need right now than any other time in our 22-year history. **We are so grateful for your financial support: it truly transforms lives.** As one student put it, "Odyssey helped me unwrap my gifts and rewrite the story of my life."

Thirteen Monona/Madison members journeyed to La Crosse for AAUW Convention 2025 on April 25-26. They included Donna Anderson, Ellen Healey, Kleo Baruth Kritz, Consuelo Lopez, Debbie Mahaffey, Val Murphy, Jennifer Ondrejka, Shiela Reaves, Pat Ruppert, Lise Skofronick, Stephanie Sorensen, Georgia Stilp, and Gail Stirr.

Guest speakers included Meghan Kissell, National AAUW Senior Director of Policy & Membership Advocacy, discussing National AAUW Public Policy in this difficult political environment. In the lobby was a colorful Wall of Positive Thoughts on which attendees could write out thoughts on a sticky note and there was also a Box of Despair, which was black with a raven next to it, in which one could also put sticky notes.

Two resolutions were passed:

- Constitution Amendment to Eliminate Big Money in Politics
- AAUW Resolution on Upholding the Civil Rights of American Who Identify as LGBTQ+








Evening Book Group

MILESTONES

Announcements from April 29, 2025 meeting, Stephanie Sorensen

- Kleo Baruth Kritz reminded everyone that they could still sign up to attend the State Convention this coming weekend and said 13 are registered from our branch. The convention will be in Madison next year and volunteers are needed.
- Val Murphy reported that suggestions she received for day trips included Mt. Horeb, New Glarus, Stoughton, Janesville for the gardens, and Epic. Another person is needed to help her plan for events.
- Liz Senseman reminded us that scholarships of \$1,000 each are given in May to one student at La Follette and one student at Monona High Schools. We also award funds to a single parent and a continuing ed student. The award ceremony for those scholarships is being held Thursday, April 24. Liz, Pat

Ruppert and Debbie Mahaffey are attending. Others are welcome to attend any of the ceremonies. She also mentioned that anyone is welcome to attend the evening book group discussions.

- Debbie Mahaffey reported that there is another opportunity to help with Girls on the Run on May 14 from 1:30 3;30 putting kits together for Race Day. There are also slots available on Race Day, May 31 starting at 8:00 am.
- Jennifer Ondrejka noted that she had sent out a survey to people she knew in the community, asking for feedback and ideas about how to better publicize our group and recruit new members. The main response was that we need a zippier, more energetic and engaging website. Georgia Stilp will be working with Maggie Winz to learn about managing a website. We need to focus on gaining some younger members.
- Sally Keyel stated that the newsletter deadline is May 7, 2025.4.30
- Consuelo Lopez reported on the issues discussed at the most recent District One meeting which included helping to get out the vote for recent elections; issues of finding appropriate meeting spaces; ideas around making ourselves more visible as community partners as well as more volunteer participation. She would like ideas for from our members by the end of the week. One thing we have done is participate as volunteers with Girls on the Run. Beaver Dam reported that their DEI efforts were bearing fruit, and that their "Artist is Residence" program has been quite challenging but bringing many community members together.

We are trying to determine "best practices" for branches to use to remain a vital organization. Thoughts from members included the question of is there a way to use and engage high school students who must complete a community service project? Could we work with the Wisconsin Women's Network for some of the projects they do? For example, volunteer on WI Women's Network on their behalf at the Brat Fest.

• A nominating committee member is needed for our branch as well as for District One. Each year each of the five Districts in the State provide one member to serve on the State Nominating committee to determine new officers

for the WI State Board. Our Monona/Madison branch will also need a member to serve on our three-person nominations committee.
